Editor's note!

Due to paucity of space, we take the liberty to give just the briefest summary of the congregational reports submitted at the "report meeting" January 17th.

PASTOR'S REPORT

The pastor, in his annual report, touched upon the threefold division of the general work, or "General Seelsorge." They are: (1) The building up of the congregation, which involves preaching, supervision of the church school, instruction of confirmands, etc. (2) Guarding the good name and altar of the church. Proper Scriptural discipline has to be carried out. (3) Directing the general work, suggesting new methods of procedure, getting members to respond to responsibilities, etc. Then there is "Private Seelsorge," pastoral visitation. How is the balance between the two: "General Seelsorge" and "Private Seelsorge," to be maintained? Shall the pastor devote himself entirely to the general church work? Or give most of his time to "Private Seelsorge"? Such is the problem in a fairly large city church. "Who is sufficient for these things?"

The church life-"General Seelsorge" -has been carried on along the same lines as of old: preaching the gospel at stated services, conducting prayer meetings, holding special meetings of various kinds. The 45th anniversary was especially helpful in developing a a deeper sense of our spiritual heritage and tradition. Our church school, as usual, has functioned as far as possible with regard to the commandment: "Go ye and teach." Our organizations have helped to develop a spirit of Christian fellowship and been an aid financially. The church boards have displayed an esprit de corps that is reflected in helpful co-operation and a genuine desire to enhance the kingdom of God.

With regard to guarding the good name of the church or the maintenance

of evangelical discipline, emphasis was placed upon the breakdown of morals in our generation and the necessity for church folks to maintain Christian standards of conduct.

As regards the directing of the congregation along the lines of evangelical endeavors, the appeal was made to be church members to engage in personal work, not merely among friends or relatives, but to touch the lives of unchurched families, whoever they might be

TRUSTEES' REPORT

The Board reported "all current obligations" paid; and \$550.00 was paid "against the \$3,000.00 notes" held by members of the congregation. Balance of note: \$2,450.00. Notes renewed a 4% basis. Total indebtedness, \$3,700.

Improvements: \$300.00 cost of painting the exterior of the parsonage and church. Church assembly rooms cleaned by a volunteer group of fifty men.

The Board also called attention to the desirability of members contributing regularly through the weekly envelopes, thus insuring the church of a steady source of income.

The Martin Johnson Estate. The sum of \$1,000.00 to be kept intact as a special fund—when said sum has accrued.

Acknowledgment was made of the Clara Seeberg Estate bequest to Bethel of \$500.00.

The Budget for 1936 is somewhat higher than 1935 and is warranted because of "what is generally considered as a better economic situation." Also Board desires to reduce notes and pay on Conference arrears.

STEWARDSHIP COMMISSION'S REPORT

The Commission has been instrumental in focusing the attention of the congregation to the principle of "direct giving." The chairman visited every home in Bethel and was also responsible for the distribution of the Annual Directory. Members were helpful in helping to provide transportation.

The Committee emphasized the need of making personal calls in the homes of the uninterested, and cultivating the art of friendliness. In regard to giving the statement was made: "Giving to the church is contagious. If one becomes interested, the giving takes care of itself." . . . "Let it be resolved: that in the year 1936 we do more personal work as individuals and as church workers."

Election of deacons and trustees, three year term. Deacons: Charles Burgeson, James Nelson and Gus O. Johnson. Trustees: Hjalmar Ahlberg (re-elected), Gust Olson and Louis Aanerud.

Miss Signe Ahlberg was elected to fill the unexpired term of Mrs. Melba McDonald, who served as auditor. Term: two years.

Election of delegates. Southern Chicago District annual meeting: Ellis Hessel, with Henry Johnson as alternate. Illinois Conference annual convention: John Westberg, with Hjalmar Ahlberg as alternate.

As head usher at the services Leon Timm was elected, with Bernard Aanerud as assistant.

The pastor was authorized to appoint the Stewardship Commission. Term: one year. Appointed: Arthur Ehrenstrom, chairman, Mrs. Gust Larson and John Burgeson, Jr.

Election of Music Committee: Mrs. Walter Peterson, Mrs. Arthur Ehrenstrom and Ernest Bratlie. All reelected for one year.

The matter of the publication of the Bethel Companion was referred to the Board of Administration with full power to act.

The report was accepted.

The Board of Trustees submitted the following recommendations:

"Whereas, a goodly number of our members are contributing to the church, as membership dues, a sum less than the amount that the congregation is obliged to pay to the Illinois Conference to retain them as members of the Conference; and

"Whereas the sum contributed is often less than the cost of publishing such contribution in the Bethel Companion;

"Thefore, Be It Resolved, that no member shall be considered as a member in good standing unless the individual contribution for the year totals the sum of \$5.00 or more; members under 18 years of age to contribute the sum of \$2.50 or more.

"Be It Further Resolved, that no contribution totaling less than \$1.25 per quarter be published in the BETHEL COMPANION and that all individual contributions totaling less than \$5.00 for the year be published in the BETHEL COMPANION as "Other Contributions" in one grand total sum.

"Be It Also Resolved, that the Board of Deacons be, and they are hereby empowered to cancel a part or all of said sum, according to their judgment.

The Board of Trustees reported on the status of the Martin Johnson Estate which was released from probate in October, 1935. The administrator, the Chicago City Bank and Trust Co., after distributing the assets of the estate to the various beneficiaries, has turned over to the Bethel Church the residue of Martin Johnson's Estate, which is on deposit with the Swedish Building and Loan Association of Chicago. Due to the inactivity of the building industry, the Association is not in a position to make payment in full of this account, but as funds become available, payments will be made from time to time.

The Board of Administration submitted the following recommendation: "The Board of Administration recommends that the Budget Committee's suggestion of \$1,200.00 per year, all or any part of which may at the discretion of the Board of Administration be accepted as the remuneration to be paid during 1936 for the services of an organist and choir director, or both, instead of \$900.00 per year now being paid to the organist. This recommendation is due to the desire to bring about what is considered as a necessary improvement in the musical part of our service."

The recommendation was accepted and the Board of Administration was given full power to act.

The Bethel Companion staff was reelected and is as follows: Rev. C. Emil Bergquist, editor-in-chief; Helen Andreen, editor; Laura Bergquist, associate editor. Business manager, Marion Neville.

The matter of a midnight service to be held Christmas Eve was discussed at length and was referred to the Board of Administration.

A vote of thanks was accorded the ping deacons and trustees, as well as the chairman of the Stewardship Commission, for faithful service rendered during their term of office.

The installation of newly elected officers was set at January 12th, at the morning service.

Regarding the "Worship and Fellowship Services" conducted by the four congregations, Bethel, Bethlehem, Grace, and Messiah, it was decided that the arrangement as set up be continued, and that whatever arrangements be made be also left to the pastors.

Upon motion it was decided that the "report meeting" be held the third Thursday evening in January, namely, the 16th.

The pastor closed the meeting with prayer and the benediction.
