CONDENSED BY-LAWS

Approved February 23, 1951

The corporate name of this organization shall be "The Swedish Club of Chicago."

The objects of this Club shall be:

To preserve through social, fraternal and educational activities the Swedish language, customs, song, music, art and industry, to encourage manly sports and to promote good fellowship and generally to secure to its members and their families the benefits of cooperation in their social, cultural and athletic life.

Memberships shall be of five classes:

Honorary, Resident, Associate, Non-Resident and Courtesy.

Honorary memberships may be conferred by the Board of Directors upon such men of distinction as it may see fit to so recognize.

In addition to the above, the following shall be Honorary members of the Club during their incumbency in office:

The Ambassador of Sweden to the United States.

The Governor of the State of Illinois.

The Mayor of the City of Chicago.

The Consul General of Sweden at Chicago.

Male persons of at least twenty-one years of age who are of Swedish descent and are of good moral character, interested in the objects and purposes of this Club, shall be eligible to Resident Membership.

The number of dues-paying Resident Memberships shall be limited to five hundred. The admission fee and annual dues for such membership shall be established from time to time by the Board of Directors.

Resident Members who have been such, and whose dues have been paid for a period of twenty-five years and who have reached the age of sixty-five years, shall then be exempt from payment of further assessments and annual dues.

Male persons of at least twenty-one years of age, who are not of Swedish descent but have the other qualifications required of Resident Members, may be admitted as Associate Members.

The number of Associate Memberships shall be limited to one hundred. The admission fee and annual dues for such membership shall be the same as those for Resident Membership.

Male persons of at least twenty-one years of age, whose residence and place of business are beyond the radius of 50 miles from the Club House and who have the other qualifications for Resident or Associate Membership, shall be eligible to Non-Resident Membership.

The number of Non-Resident Memberships shall be limited to two hundred. The admission fee and annual dues for Non-Resident Membership may be established from time to time by the Board of Directors.

An Associate Member as well as a Non-Resident Member shall be entitled to all of the privileges of the Club, except voting, holding office, or having any right, title, or interest in the property of the Club.

The Board of Directors may by unanimous vote confer a Courtesy Membership upon any person deemed by it to be eligible thereto by reason of his position in the community or his achievement in furthering the objects and welfare of the Club. A Courtesy Membership shall be non-transferable and shall continue at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Resident Memberships may be transferred by gift or by heritage to the holder's son, grandson or son-in-law, if of Swedish descent, or by sale, provided the transferee is an eligible candidate, approved by the Board of Directors.

Dues shall be due and payable quarterly in advance on the first day of April, which shall be the beginning of the Club's fiscal year, and on the first day of each successive quarter.

All accounts and debts of members to the Club, other than dues, shall be payable not later than the tenth day of the month following that in which they were incurred.

Guests who are not residents of the City of Chicago may be introduced to the Club upon such terms and for such time as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine. Members introducing guests shall be responsible for any indebtedness incurred by such guests. If a guest of any member shall have failed to pay any indebtedness to the Club, within the month succeeding that in which it was incurred, such indebtedness shall then be charged to the member who introduced such guest and become an indebtedness of such member.

HOUSE RULES

(Subject to change by the Board of Directors)

Members are required to sign checks with name, address and account number.

When meals are served hours will be from 12 to 2 and from 6 to 8 P. M. on week days, Sundays 2 to 8 P. M.; banquets and special dinners by arrangement.

No subscription, petition, announcement, card or matter of any kind not authorized by the Board of Directors shall be distributed, circulated or posted in the Club House or sent out through the Club.

No articles shall be advertised, exposed or offered for sale, and raffles and lotteries are forbidden.

No list of members shall be given out for any purpose.

No employee of the Club shall be sent on errands outside of the Club House.

All private property while in the Club House shall be at the owner's risk.

Members shall pay for all damages caused by themselves and their guests.

No animals will be allowed in the Club House.

Cards and other games will be permitted only in the rooms set apart for such purposes. The Board of Directors shall exercise its authority to suppress any and all games which in its opinion may bring the Club into disrepute.

A member signing another's name or number, or permitting another to sign his name or number, or signing a ticket after having been notified that he is in arrears, may be suspended or expelled.

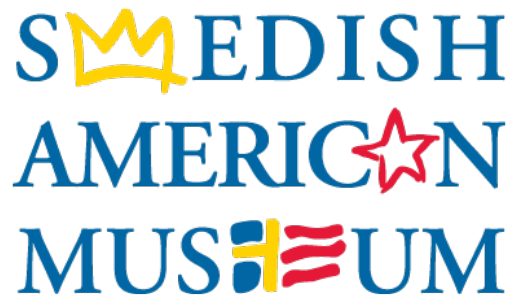
