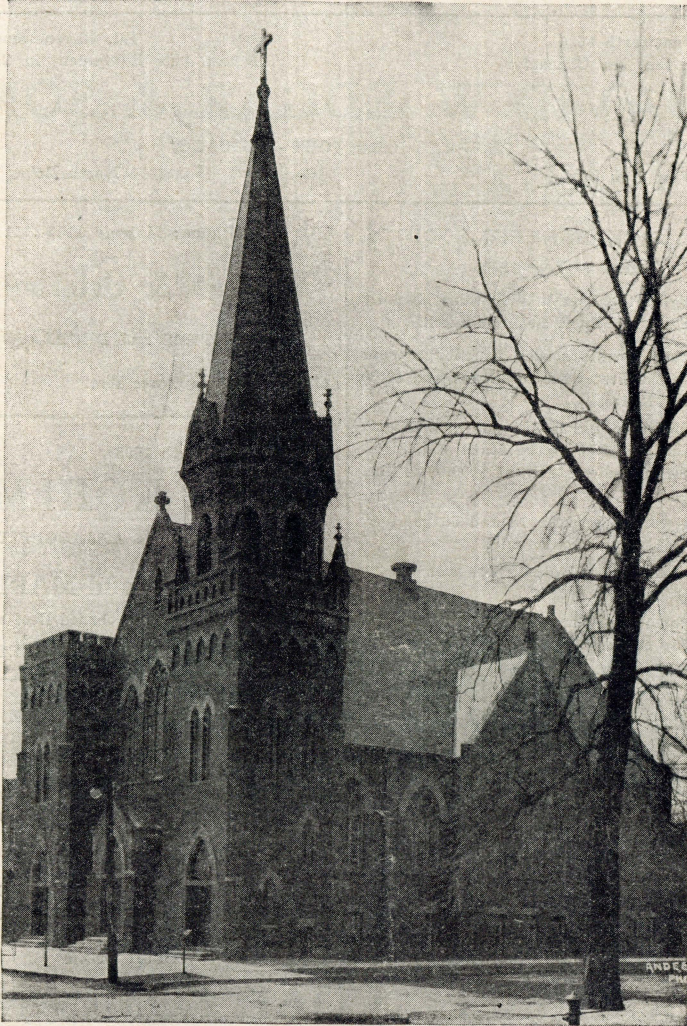

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Bethel Lutheran Church,

held Thursday evening, December 1,
1932, at 8 p. m., after a short devo-
tional meeting had been conducted.

The first order of business was the
election of a recording secretary for
the year 1933. Mr. John Westberg
was reelected secretary.

The minutes of the adjourned meet-
ing held January 21, 1932, were read

and approved. There were also read
the minutes of an extra meeting held
Sunday, June 5th, 1932, and a com-
munication sent to Dr. G. A. Bran-
delle, President of the Augustana Syn-
od, inviting the Synodical Convention
to be held at our church in 1933. These
were approved.

The tellers for this meeting, ap-

pointed by the chairman, were: Harry Paulson, Rustan Olund, Arvid Grell, Carl T. Seaberg, J. Lundquist, J. Liden, and John Burgeson, Jr.

The following were elected deacons for the three-year period, 1933-1934-1935; Jas. F. Josephson, reelected; Claus Johnson, and Henry Larson.

The trustees elected for the three-year period, 1933-1934-1935 were: Hjalmer Ahlberg, Arthur Ehrenstrom and John Burgeson—all reelected. Gust Johnson was elected for a two-year period, 1933-1934, to fill the vacancy of Carl H. Johnson, who has moved from Chicago.

Walter Peterson was elected auditor for 1933-1934, to fill a vacancy.

John Westberg was elected delegate to the Southern Chicago District meeting, with Henry Johnson as alternate.

Arthur Ehrenstrom was elected delegate to the Illinois Conference, with Mr. Claus Johnson as alternate.

The election of a head usher was referred to the Board of Administration.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the salary of the organist and choir leader, Mr. Ralph Peterson, is to remain the same as it is now; namely, \$1,000.00 per year.

The salary of the pastor is to remain the same as it now is, namely, \$3,000.00 per year, including gas, light,

heat and telephone service. The pastor donates a month's salary as well as expense for gas and light.

The salary of the janitor was referred to the Board of Trustees.

On motion duly made and seconded, the matter of our congregation's pledge to the Illinois Conference Budget for the year of 1933, was referred to the joint Board of Administration, with full power to act.

A vote of thanks was extended to Miss Svea Broman, organist, at our midweek services, for the fine service she has rendered.

Arrangements for the summer school were referred to the Board of Deacons.

The following recommendations were presented by the Board of Trustees:

I. That authority be granted them to borrow a sum, not to exceed \$5,000.00, for the purpose of meeting our Conference obligations and retiring outstanding loans. A motion was made, seconded and carried to table this recommendation until the Report meeting.

II. That a Board of Stewards be elected to carry out an educational program under supervision of the Board of Administration; said body to disseminate information concerning our institutions and various church activities. On motion duly made and seconded this recommendation was accepted.

III. That a committee be appointed to investigate our lighting system, to determine what savings can be accomplished by the installation of up-to-date equipment, and to report to the congregation at its next meeting. A motion was made and carried to refer it to the Board of Trustees.

The trustees, through Mr. Arthur Ehrenstrom, presented the following budget setting forth the anticipated income and expenses for 1933 and requested the authority of the congre-

gation to present the budget to the various societies of the church:

Minutes of the Adjourned Meeting—Jan. 19, 1933.

The minutes of the adjourned meeting held Thursday evening, January 19th, 1933. The meeting was called to order by Rev. C. Emil Bergquist, having been preceded by a short devotional service. The minutes of the regular annual meeting held December 1st, 1932, were read and approved.

The pastor's report was read by himself and upon a motion duly made and seconded, was accepted and ordered spread upon the official record of the congregation.

The annual report of the trustees was read by the chairman, Mr. Hjalmar Ahlberg and upon motion duly made and seconded was accepted and made a part of these minutes. This report will be found in the BETHEL COMPANION.

The financial secretary's report presented by Mr. Melvin Olson, and the

treasurer's report, submitted by Mr. L. C. Larson, were both duly accepted and ordered spread upon the minutes. Both of these reports had been previously audited and found to be correct by the auditing committee.

The reports of the various organizations were presented and read at this meeting. They were accepted and ordered placed in the official record.

Excerpts from the Pastor's Report.

EDITOR'S NOTE: The pastor has purposely "boiled down" his report. Space is precious. Read and reread the different reports and thus visualize the service rendered by Bethel in the past year.

The pastor in his Annual Report stressed the verse, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." Despite the critical period in which we live, God is our source of help and strength. Bethel has experienced this truth the past year. A review of the various phases of our church life clearly reveals this truth. The English services have been very well attended; the Swedish continue to hold their own. Our "Youth Worship Service," the purpose of which is to train our younger generation, has been very helpful. Granger Westberg rendered invaluable assistance in organizing a choir and planning the details.

Church School.

Our Church School has an enrollment now of 487—the 500-mark will

soon be reached. Teachers and officers 48. Rev. Vincent Nordgren and his wife were here last fall and conducted an institute. Our choir, under the direction of Ralph Peterson, has, as usual, rendered faithful service.

Communion services have been well attended. Prayer meetings likewise. Special weeks, such as Universal Prayer Week, Holy Week and "Week of Penitence and Prayer," were observed. Our organizations have all done splendid service. The organizations have also sponsored different services Sunday evenings.

Special Events.

The Augustana Synod has accepted the invitation of the Bethel Church to hold its 1933 convention in our church.

The Bethel Emergency Relief Station (see Minutes of Secretary) has performed a beautiful service in ministering to the "least of these my brethren." God has blessed this movement. In January a dinner was served 125 people in connection with the baptismal ceremony—Day of Presentation of Christ in the Temple.

Summer School had an enrollment of 83. Teachers: the pastor, Laura Bergquist, Svea Johnson, Olga Anderson.

Sunday, May 1st, 43 were confirmed. Adult class of 8 likewise confirmed.

Bethel has endeavored to do its share in raising funds for our hospital. (See report in Minutes.)

The congregation during the past year placed Mr. John Walgren in the Augustana Home for the Aged. Mr. Walgren has served Bethel over a long period of years.

A number of members have passed from our midst this past year. We miss them, to say the least.

Weddings 23 couples—5 members.

By confirmation 43; 8 adults confirmed.

Dropped or placed on inactive list 53.

Baptisms 76.

The pastor would call the attention of the members to our different reports appearing in this number. From our vantage ground we feel that 1932 has been in many respects a year of helpful, Christlike service.

A committee consisting of Mr. Gust Johnson, Mrs. F. T. Westberg and Mrs. Gust Larson was appointed last year to arrange for a place at the Augustana Home for the Aged for Mr. J. A. Walgren. This has been done and Mr. Walgren is now located at the home. This committee will continue to function until all the financial matters connected with the situation have been settled.

The organizations of the congregation sponsored a dinner for the benefit of Augustana Hospital, June 16th, 1932. The sum raised counting pledges that evening was \$333.40. So far \$253.81 has been realized on this sum. Later \$11.81 was turned in. The pastor-canvassers raised in pledges a goodly sum for the hospital. Inasmuch as these were not direct no report is given of the total sum realized.

The Emergency Relief Station has received from fifty-seven bakeries in our neighborhood, pastries, pies, coffee cakes, rolls and bread loaves to the amounts of \$3,458.30 which has been distributed to people out of work and to the needy in general, irrespec-

tive of race. One hundred ten Thanksgiving baskets and 105 Christmas baskets were distributed during 1932. Five thousand, four hundred and fifty-one garments were given away, fourteen children were clothed for their confirmation, five children received medical attention, four of these were operated upon, receiving physicians' and hospital care, free, through the influence of the Relief Station. One hundred and ten bushels of pears and one truckload of various vegetables were donated to the station and were distributed among the needy. At the present time, six men without homes, are receiving food and shelter at the Relief Station.

The relief work was started in 1931 in the basement of the Bethel church, but because of better facilities moved to the present quarters on the corner of 59th and May Streets, on June 11th, 1932, where they are occupying two vacant stores, rent free. One of the stores is being used for religious services every Wednesday night. These services are conducted by our neighboring Lutheran pastors, with an attendance of from sixty to one hundred persons at every meeting. All this work is under the supervision of the Bethel Church Emergency Relief Committee with Mr. Ray Malmquist as its director.

The secretary was ordered to send a letter of thanks to all church organizations for the work and contributions which they have so willingly performed during the past year.

To constitute a committee on flowers for Sunday Worship Services, the following were asked to serve for this year: Mrs. Axel Olson and Mrs. J. E. Nelson.

This committee makes it possible for the members of the church to furnish flowers in memory of some loved ones or anniversary occasions or birthdays to be observed in this manner.

To Mr. Ray Malmquist and all his coworkers in the Emergency Relief Station, the congregation extends thanks for their untiring work which they are daily performing at the station.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned with the benediction by the pastor.

Bethel Senior Luther League President's Report, 1932.

The Bethel Senior Luther League had eleven meetings during year 1932 with an average attendance of 100 members per meeting. During the year we had 160 registered visitors, a small part of the actual number.

Our entire membership was divided into five teams, each taking one of the five colors, of the Lutheran Emblem for their name; namely, black, red, white, blue and gold. A contest was conducted throughout the year and points were earned for various duties and accomplishments. The White Team won the contest and were the guests of the four losing teams at a banquet held at the Broadview Hotel on December 16th.

Our meetings have consisted of—singing led by a leaguer; devotions also by a leaguer; business conducted by the president; musical, educational or spiritual programs prepared by the team in charge; and refreshments. At the September meeting we had a "Stunt Night."

Six Sunday evening services were sponsored and also one service during week of "Repentance and Prayer." We sponsored a Thanksgiving Sunrise Service and invited the local leagues of the Southern Chicago District. After this service, breakfast was served. At the May meeting we had the members of the Junior Luther League with us as our guests.

We had two money-making projects,

a series of stereopticon lectures on the "Redemptive Passion" held on six consecutive Thursday nights during the Lenten Season. Also "The Spotlight," an exhibit sale on May 18th.

Our social times were sponsored by the various teams and came in addition to our regular league meetings.

At the quarterly district meetings, Bethel had the largest attendance at three out of the four meetings held. We have won a picture twice for having the largest attendance and if we can win it at two more meetings, the picture will be ours.

Melba Newstrom represented Bethel in the Luther League Oratorical Contest and she came out the winner at the District eliminations and at the Conference eliminations she came in second. Her topic was on "Stewardship."

A greater friendship has grown among our young people and their cooperation in league work has been splendid as has been exemplified in their faithfulness in all our undertakings and also resulted in obtaining 53 new members during the year 1932.

Report of Board of Trustees for Year 1932.

The records of your Board of Trustees for the year 1932 reveal a fine spirit of both moral and financial support of our church for which we are thankful.

To begin with we will mention the contribution of the following organizations: Dorcas Society, \$1,200.00; Sunday School, \$400.00; Luther League, 250.00; Brotherhood, \$175.00; Bethel Circle, \$100.00.

We are also mindful of the individual members who have done all that circumstances will permit and it is our earnest hope and prayer that the same spirit of sacrifice will prevail throughout 1933.

It is fitting that mention be made of the personal sacrifice in this respect, on the part of our pastor, Rev. C. E. Bergquist, who has voluntarily refunded a substantial part of his salary, which is greatly appreciated.

There has been considerable work done in and about the church premises during the year and to those whose names are not mentioned but who have given freely of their time and efforts we are deeply grateful. Under the supervision of Mr. Gustav Johnson and Ray Malmquist, a crew of men labored faithfully for days, without compensation, cleaning and calcimining the church parlors. The pews and lower sections of walls of the auditorium were thoroughly washed and the balcony seats varnished, at a minimum expense; namely, for cleaning materials and meals for the workers.

The new sexton assumed his duties early in the year and has done his work in a satisfactory manner. His

apartment was thoroughly cleaned and renovated. A new gas stove was installed and linoleum laid on the kitchen floor.

In return for services rendered the pastor had necessary work done in the parsonage at his own expense and in general has improved the property including a room in the front of the basement.

The regular pay roll has been met promptly (which by way of information was lower than the previous year by about \$800.00 as will be noted from the treasurer's report) and except for a few outstanding bills, all accounts have been taken care of in the usual manner, including the final payment for the electrification of the organ.

It is the Conference obligation which faces us now and probably the only way to meet the same is to borrow funds for that purpose. The plan outlined at the annual meeting would solve that problem and also take care of the outstanding notes for loans made a year ago.

In view of present conditions we believe our physical condition to be as good as can be expected and while we do not approve of our going into debt any more than is absolutely necessary, it seems that our indebtedness is not more than we can reasonably hope to get from under in due course of time.

The regular Dorcas meeting was held Jan. 18th, Mrs. G. E. Larson, the reelected chairman, presiding. Song No. 132 was sung, after which Rev. Bergquist conducted the devotions. Then English song No. 101—"Love One Another" was sung. In memory of Mr. and Mrs. Kjellberg, at request

of the daughters present, the society sang Swedish song No. 45.

The minutes of the December meeting were read and after corrections, approved. Installation of officers was conducted by Rev. Bergquist. **REPORTS:** *Financial Secretary*, Disbursements \$235.00; 179 members recorded; \$225.00, dues outstanding. *Treasurer*, Balance to date \$127.08. Flowers given to Mrs. Bradish and Mrs. Wistrom. *Helping Hand* \$4.09. *Corresponding Secretary*, 22 Christmas cards sent to shut-ins. *Social Secretary*, hostesses for February: Mesdames H.
