come right away. It's an empty
world without you dear, I'm not
myself when you're not here. So
don't forget your hubby is waiting
for your return. By the way, when
are you coming home?

Wednesday night I went to
choir and the auditing committee
met later and signed the books.

Thursday night, what a time!
We had annual church meeting,
reports read and election of trustees.
And such an election! It took
two hours. Morland was afraid
Austin wanted to control the property.
Finally they acquiesced and elections
took place - 5 from Austin + 4 from
Morland.

Tonight it's raining and your

folks are going to the Wedding
and my folks are going along
to a Birthday party on Mrs.
Ed. Johnson.

Gee, how but I miss you!

How do you suppose we could
manage some way to get along
if we married and got a flat
somewhere? Times are against
us, but I need you, Worling,
beyond a doubt.

I think I'll get in touch
with Vera Freidlund and

In the spring, if we couldn't
find anything else we could
go to 624 N. second floor.

Fix it up to suit ourselves
and have it pretty nice. That's
not the worst place we could

talk so much. But back to

me what you think, Sweetheart.
And in the meanwhile I'll find out.
I'm getting lots of rest nights now. Last
night I hit the bed at 9:15 and didn't

is lonesome. You just see when
