## THE CONCESSION TICKETS OFFER ADMISSION TO:

- 1—**HORTICULTURAL EXHIBITION, GARDEN AND FLOWER SHOW**—an area of over five acres devoted to the exhibits of horticulture. This is an unforgettable, glamorous spectacle of rare, colorful and exotic beauty. Here you will see gardens of every description to inspire and thrill you; with continuous special feature flower shows daily by America's foremost growers. You may dine and dance on the Balcony Restaurant overlooking the gardens and lake.
- 2—**BLACK FOREST VILLAGE, "A WHITE VILLAGE"**—from the "BLACK FOREST" region, as authentic in detail as though transplanted bodily from Germany to A Century of Progress Exposition, with its people, costumes, music and varied industries shown in a complete winter setting. Air-cooled restaurants, winter sports, including ice-skating, and—everywhere—that delightful atmosphere the German people call "Gemütlichkeit."
- 3—**OLD ENGLAND**—Cross the drawbridge 'neath the thundering Norman tower and live in Merrie England.
