Dear Brother Nordling,

This letter will no doubt be a surprise to you as was the occasion of it to me. Last Sunday morning I held a little communion service with 30 men who were going to sea. After the service one of them came to me and asked if I had noticed that he had not gone to communion. The reason, he said, was that he was not a member of the Lutheran Church but would like to be. However, he was going to sea the next day so there was no time for the customary instruction. He said that he had attended services at your church and also our Lutheran services at the station. As he wanted communion very badly before he left I decided that I had no right to keep him from it, so after pointing out in a few words the essentials of Christianity and the difference between the Lutheran Church and the catholic, he was a former catholic, I confirmed him and gave him Holy Communion. He expressed a desire to affiliate with your church altho he is not of Swedish extraction. His home is at 3323 N. Hamilton Ave, but I would not advise you to see his parents as they are catholics. Please enroll him with your communicants and as soon as he sends me his new address I will inform you so that you can keep in touch with him.
