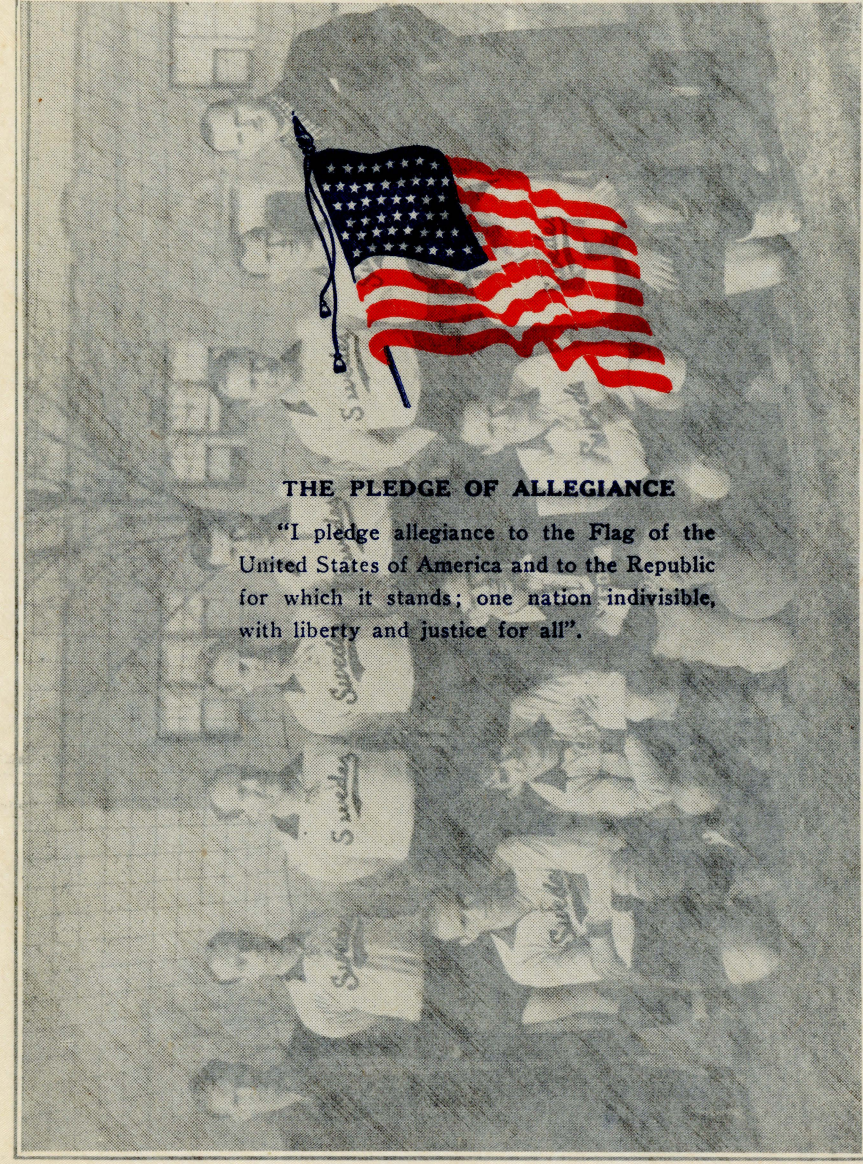

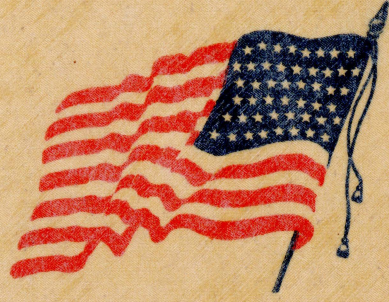


THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

SWEDISH AMERICAN ATHLETIC DAY

June 8, 1941

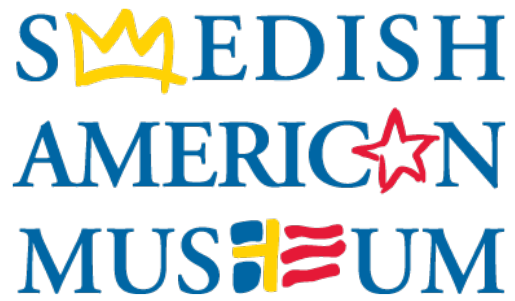
