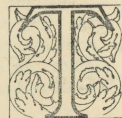

CONDENSED BY-LAWS



The corporate name of this organization shall be "The Swedish Club of Chicago."

The objects of this Club shall be as follows:

The preservation through social and fraternal activities of the Swedish language, customs, song, music, art and industry, to encourage manly sports and to promote good fellowship and generally to secure to its members and their families the benefits of cooperation in their social, cultural and athletic life.

Memberships shall be of six classes: Honorary, Resident, Associate, Non-Resident, Veteran and Courtesy.

Male persons, twenty-one years or over, descendants of Swedish parents, interested in the objects and purposes of this Club, shall be eligible to membership.

Male persons, not descendants of Swedish parents may be admitted as Associate and Non-Resident Members.

Honorary Memberships may be conferred by the Board of Directors on such persons as they may wish to so recognize.

The following shall be Honorary members during their incumbency in office:

The Swedish Minister at Washington.

The Governor of the State of Illinois.

The Mayor of the City of Chicago.

The Swedish Consul at Chicago.

The number of Resident Memberships shall be limited to five hundred. The fee for such membership may be established from time to time by the Board of Directors.

The number of Associate Memberships shall be limited to one hundred. The fee for such membership shall be the same as that for Resident Membership as established from time to time by the Board of Directors. An Associate member shall be entitled to all of the privileges of the Club, except voting, holding office, or having any right to, title or interest in the property of the Club. Such member-

ship shall be non-transferable, non-salable and non-heritable.

The number of Non-Resident Memberships shall be limited to two hundred. The fee for such membership may be established from time to time by the Board of Directors. A man whose residence and place of business are beyond a radius of fifty miles from the Club House shall be eligible to such membership. A Non-Resident Member shall be entitled to all of the privileges of the Club, except voting, holding office, or having any right to, title to, or interest in the property of the Club.

Resident Members of this Club who have been such and whose dues have been paid for a period of twenty-eight years and who have reached the age of sixty-five years may, upon application to the Board of Directors, be transferred to Veteran Membership. A Veteran Member shall be exempt from assessments and annual dues. He shall be entitled to all the privileges of the Club except having a right to, title to, or interest in the property of the Club. The Membership shall be non-transferable, non-salable and non-heritable.

Any person who has rendered valuable services to the club may be elected a Courtesy Member by a unanimous vote of the Board of Directors. Such membership shall be exempt from dues, and shall be non-transferable.

Resident and Non-Resident Memberships shall be transferable by heritage, by gift, or by sale to an eligible candidate, approved by the Board of Directors.

Dues shall be due and payable quarterly in advance on the first day of April, which shall be the beginning of the Club's fiscal year, and on the first day of each successive quarter.

All accounts and debts of members to the Club, other than dues, shall be payable not later than the tenth day of the month following that in which they were incurred.

Guests who are not residents of the City of Chicago may be introduced to the Club upon such terms and for such time as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine. Members introducing guests shall be responsible for any in-

debtedness incurred by such guests. If a guest of any member shall have failed to pay any indebtedness to the Club, within the month succeeding that in which it was incurred, such indebtedness shall then be charged to the member who introduced such guest and become an indebtedness of such member.

HOUSE RULES

(Subject to change by the Board of Directors)

Members are required to sign checks with name and membership card number.

When meals are served hours will be from 12 to 2 and from 6 to 8 P. M. on week days, Sundays 4 to 8 P. M.; banquets and special dinners by arrangement.

Sandwiches may be obtained at reasonable hours.

No subscription, petition, announcement, card or matter of any kind not authorized by the Board of Directors shall be distributed, circulated or posted in the Club house or sent out through the Club.

No articles shall be advertised, exposed or offered for sale, and raffles and lotteries are forbidden.

No list of members shall be given out for any purpose.

No employee of the Club shall be sent on errands outside of the Club-house.

All private property while in the Club-house shall be at the owner's risk.

Members shall pay for all damages caused by themselves, their guests or visitors.

No animals will be allowed in the Club-house.

Cards and other games will be permitted only in the rooms set apart for such purposes. The Board of Directors shall exercise its authority to suppress any and all games which in its opinion may bring the Club into disrepute.

A member signing another's name or number, or permitting another to sign his name or number, or signing a ticket after having been notified that he is in arrears, may be suspended or expelled.

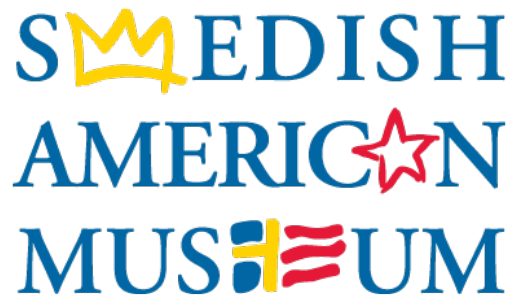
