danger of walking the streets anyway.

THE PLAN

Instead of conducting one Down Town Night School, this year there will be a Winter Institute on each side of the city. The first will be on the West Side.

The Winter Institute will combine the best features of an institute and a night school. This plan will bring an institute to our own door and put at our service some of the best teachers and leaders of Chicago Methodism. What the Lake Geneva and Des Plaines Institutes have meant to us during the summer, the Winter Institute offers us this fall. It will afford an excellent preparation for Win-My-Chum week and aid every department of young people's work. It likewise affords excellent training for Sunday School teachers. No work could be of more vital importance to Epworth League and Sunday School workers than such an opportunity for training, inspiration and fellowship.

Place—The school will meet in the commodious quarters of Olivet Church, which is located on the corner of West Adams Street and South Keeler Avenue. It is equipped with excellent class rooms, comfortable parlors and ample facilities for committee meetings and for fellowship.

To reach the church, take the Garfield Park branch, Metropolitan "L" to Tripp Avenue, walk one block east and four blocks north, or take the Madison Street or Crawford Ave. Surface Lines.

Fees—The enrollment fee will be 75c. This should be paid in advance.

Time—7:00 to 9:25 every Tuesday night, from October 4th to November 8th.

7:55 to 8:40—Departmental Hour.

The Courses of Study

First Period 7:00 - 7:55

THE GENERAL HOUR

The Evening Watch—Twenty minute addresses on Evangelism, in preparation for Win-My-Chum week, by Dr. Stone, the popular superintendent of the Chicago Western District and author of the Epworth League Study Book on Evangelism.

Thirty-five Minute Lectures on the Book of Acts, showing the beginnings of the Christian Church, its relations to Judaism and the significance of Paul and his journeys.
Dr. Lesemann.

Second Period 7:55 - 8:40

FOUR CLASSES

(1) **Mission Study:** Textbook, John Wesley, Jr., by Brummitt. The popular story of the results of an institute and a survey of the missionary forces of Methodism.
Rev. Moore.

(2) **The Social Mission of the Church:** This course deals with the modern social movement; the socialized church; programs of community service and of world brotherhood.
Miss Chappell.

(3) **The Psalms as Daily Companions:** The study of the character and beauty of the Psalms and their historical setting. Text by Morgan.
Dr. Lesemann.

(4) **Principles and Methods of Sunday School Work:** Primary Department—A study of the Beginners and Primary groups in the Sunday School; their characteristics; the problem of grading; of attendance; equipment and materials; methods of teaching.
Miss Hargraves.

Third Period 8:40 - 9:25

THREE CLASSES

(1) **Recreational Activities:** The place of recreation in the life of youth. Study of the workable plan; problems of recreation in the church. Textbook, "Recreation for Young and Old," by Ebright.
Rev. White.

(2) **Junior League Methods:** The importance of the Junior League; how to organize a Junior League; the available materials; methods which are workable in a city church.
Miss Shufelt.

(3) **Principles and Methods of Sunday School Work:** Junior and Intermediate Departments. Study of the work with boys and girls between ages of 9 and 14; how to interest them; what to teach them and what to do with them.
Miss Hargraves.

ADDITIONAL CLASSES

If the advanced registration indicates a sufficient demand for the same, the following special classes will be organized: A class in

- (a) Sunday School Principles and Methods for the Senior Department.
- (b) A class in First Department League Methods, and
- (c) A class for Executive League Officers.

SUGGESTIONS

Be a Booster. Appoint a committee in your Epworth League and in your Sunday School to work up an attendance. See that full announcement is made.

Secure as many advance registrations as possible. This will aid in determining the best adjustment of classes and insure a larger attendance. Send the registrations promptly to the Registrar, Mr. Leon Laurion, Jr., 4740 W. Congress St., Chicago.

Ask your Epworth League to pay the enrollment fee of your cabinet members and also your Sunday School Board to provide for the enrollment of Sunday School officers and teachers. It will be a splendid investment.

A free registration will be granted to every church which enrolls ten persons, and an additional free registration for each additional group of ten students enrolled from the same church.

Be sure to come the first night. Bring your songs and your yells as well as your Bibles, pencils and note-books. Remember the date—October 4th.

To meet the needs of young people desiring to prepare for a Christian vocation or special work in the local church, who are unable to attend the regular day school, the Chicago Training School will schedule a limited number of evening classes at the school buildings.

The following courses are offered every Monday and Thursday night during the first Quarter, September 29th to December 22nd:

(1) **Outline Studies of the New Testament** (part first). 7:00 P.M. A study of the background of the Apostolic Age; a survey of the contents and chief message of the Book of Acts.

Instructor: Prof. Frank S. Hickman, S.T.B.

(2) **Elements of Sociology.** 8:00 P.M. A study of the social process; biological and social factors; social control. The development of social science.

Instructor: Miss Winifred L. Chappell, A.M.

(3) **English Composition and Rhetoric.** 8:00 P.M. Consideration of the following subjects: Correct English; the power to think clearly; the process of organization; the development of a theme.

Instructor: Mrs. Veve C. Hickman, A.M.

No one of these courses will be offered to a class of less than eight students.

The work and assignments are the same as in the day classes and receive equal credit.

The charge for these courses is \$2.00 per Quarter for each course.

Students registering for these courses may take their dinner at the Training School on the evenings in question. (Special rate, 40c per plate.)
